5. CAPTAIN'S REPORT

Lady President, Ladies. Good morning and welcome to the AGM. It is wonderful to see so many members here and I thank you for all your support today and during my year as Captain. A special welcome to Cheryl Power, our KCLGA County Captain. I believe Cheryl has been a member of our Society for 16 years as we were both Club Captains in the same year. I also look forward to meeting our Speaker Chris Hare, who will entertain us after the lunch.

2018 has been one of weather extremes. This time last year the Beast from the East abated just in time for a thaw and thankfully after some doubt we were able to go ahead with the AGM and lunch when Nicholas Owen entertained us with an informative and humorous talk about his life and career as a journalist and broadcaster. The year has flown by and here we are again today.

There has been excellent support for all the matches, fun and social days out, played in a competitive but very friendly spirit. They say the sun shines on the righteous which was the case at every match apart from the one with the Kent Captains at West Kent in August. I must have done something very naughty for as we drove off, there was heavy rain and then thunder and lightening struck. After 5 holes we were called off the course which had become waterlogged and so had the players! Harry Wanless, Match Organiser, arranged for the meal to be brought forward two hours and a tasty dinner was appreciated by everyone. An honourable draw was agreed with Mike Lintonbon, the Mens' Captain.

In June on a lovely summer's day we beat Sussex away at Willingdon, Nr. Eastbourne, 4.5 to 3.5 and halved the return match at King's Hill in September. We also halved our match with Essex played at Sittingbourne on another very hot day. On 28th June, in the continuous heatwave, we played Surrey away at Walton Heath. The heat and the heather defeated us all and we lost 7/1. The Surrey Captain was a member at Walton Heath and arranged for a delicious meal in the Ryder Cup dining room where we were surrounded by mementos and photographs of golfing history. Some ladies were also lucky to spot Justine Rose assisting Sky television with preparation for the British Masters held in October.

Finally our committee had hoped to continue the match versus KCLGA committee but this was

postponed and we hope can be played this year.

Now on to our Spring, Cobnuts and Autumn meetings which again have all been very well supported.

The Spring meeting at Bearsted G.C. was thankfully a dry but breezy day. 68 players entered and at 9.10 am Laura Pickett of Nizels G.C. started her round with a hole in one at the 1st hole. Laura was presented with a glass paperweight engraved with the Society's initials. Instead of buying drinks we thank Laura for her donation of £75 towards Society expenses. With 76 players we were fortunate to use three starting tees which greatly helped the flow of the competition. The winners, Sheila Fullager and Margaret Fullager (Faversham G.C.) won the Armada Dishes and Diane Lemerle and Bridget Groves (Lamberhurst G.C.) the Anne Vines Cups. We were well looked after by Wildernesse who truly spoiled us with a marvellous cold buffet and delicious desserts.

I thank all the golf clubs and their Lady Captains where our meetings and matches have been held for their support and help on the day. We depend on these clubs to be able to offer a package which is attractive to our members and I thank them most sincerely for their consideration. A special thank you to Bearsted G.C. who for many years have accommodated the Society for our committee meetings and the Annual Past Presidents and Captains Meeting and Lunch and more recently our Incoming Captains Meeting.

In future we will ask any members requiring a buggy to book with the Club Professional but they must also inform the Competition Organiser.

Sue Jones, Treasurer, keeps all our monies and membership records up to date.

7. COUNT CAPTAIN'S REPORT

Thank you for inviting me here to give you an update on KCLGA activities. We have had an excellent year with an increased support for our County Competitions which is in part due to us using of our website and social media more to reach out and make more and more members aware of our existence and of what we offer. Our newsletter is now up to around 1,000 subscribers which helps us communicate regularly.

With online entries for all our competitions now fully up and running, it has also made everything a lot easier, both for entrants and for us.

We will be running our usual competitions for Members - the Team Rumble, Doxford Trophies, ABC Meeting, Three Feathers and the Championships, along with all our Club knockouts and many of these events have been subsidised making them very good value for money.

We continue to encourage and support our Junior girls of all ages and handicaps and they had their usual busy schedule this last year with handicaps tumbling continuously. Training was very successful and the girls always look forward to it and thoroughly enjoy the sessions which mainly take place at Pedham Place.

We are very lucky to have a very talented and enthusiastic Junior Squad coming through and they narrowly missed 2nd place at Junior County Week. We have a chance to do well this year with them showing a great commitment to the County and they are all really excited and if it doesn't happen this year, then certainly the following year when they will have another year's experience under their belts as they are still very young. This year's Junior County Week is at Hayward's Heath, Sussex, in August.

We have a new Junior Organiser in Lily Price from Royal Blackheath who is doing a great job and really enjoying this role. We are working on team bonding with social gatherings and they have recently undertaken some fund raising and a few of the parents have kindly provided sponsorship for new kit etc, all really positive and a great way of creating good team spirit.

At this point I'd like to thank this Society for their very generous £200 donation for our Juniors. It is much appreciated..

Our Junior County Champion this year was Millie Thompson for Sittingbourne

Our new Junior Captain this year is Annabel Dalton from Knole Park who is enjoying her role.

The England Golf sponsored Girls Golf Rocks Programme is going ahead again this year and Kent Golf have set up Junior Academies around the County, both of these initiatives aimed at new to golf girls and boys and its all looking very encouraging.

To back this up, it is important that Clubs are welcoming and encouraging to junior players and I know we have Clubs in Kent that do a fantastic job in this regard, offering membership at very low prices with free lessons, good access to the course, arranging competitions etc for these young players. However, more clubs need to follow suit in order for us to be successful in attracting and retaining these youngsters and keeping them wanting to continue to play golf.

Our first team also looks strong with our girls coming back from the US to play for us in the Summer at County Week having also just missed out on 2nd spot last year. This year's County Week is at Hendon Golf Club in Middlesex at the end of June

Our County Champion this year was Darcie Smith from Chart Hills.

Our 2nd team ran by Anne Billings, my Vice Captain, and our Seniors, ran by Angela Jones, also enjoyed their golf this year whilst also not actually bringing home any silverware.

Our Senior County Champion was Ingrid Long from Sundridge Park.

For those of you who might not know, Anne had a very serious back operation last month but is recovering well and hopes to be up and about very soon.

I wanted to mention that we have introduced a new Competition this year, a 36 hole Seniors Stroke Play Championship which is to be played over 2 days at Sundridge Park on the East Course on the 8th & 9th August. Please try and support this event if you can. The handicap limit is 24 and there will be both scratch and handicap trophies and prizes as well as age specific prizes, over 50's, 60's and 70s. Full details and the Entry Form are on the Kent Ladies website. The scratch aggregate winner over the 36 holes will go on to represent Kent at the England Golf Seniors Champion of Champions event at Woodhall Spa in September.

I am absolutely delighted that Tita McCart has taken on the role of Kent Ladies Vice Captain and we have been working well together already with her very successfully having taken on the role of County Training Officer during the year. This role is now needing to be filled of course.

I am very much looking forward to the year ahead with a wonderful hard working Committee who I know will support me throughout and work hard on behalf of ladies golf in the County.

Finally, I would like to let you know that next month we will be resuming talks with the KGU about the possible merger (or Unification which it is now being called) between our two organisations. We will obviously keep everyone informed of developments
